In a bowl, mix:-

5 cups flour

1 tsp salt.

In a saucepan mix:-

 $\frac{1}{4}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$ cup warm water

Add 1 - 2 oz butter

1 dsp sugar

Stir until melted.

Take off heat and add enough milk to cool to blood heat.

Add $15g = 3\frac{1}{2}$ tsp dried bread year.

Beat with fork and let froth.

Add to flour mix and knead lightly.

Leave to rise.

Make into scone size and fry in butter.

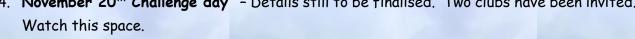

- 5. WET WIPES; Members are reminded not to use wet wipes when using the toilet facilities. They clog up the septic tank.

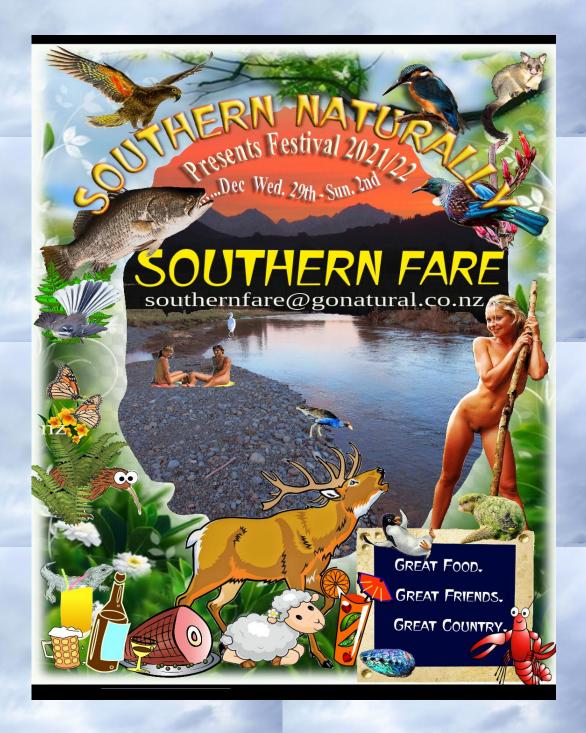


- 6. Members are reminded <u>NOT</u> to divulge other members' names to others outside our club
