A couple of our stalwart members Ken and Rae played a valuable role in the sale then subsequent purchase in 1993 of this property in Matangi. You will have heard at times me and others relating some of the details of their dedication, financial sacrifices and many many hours of bloody hard work they gave to build the feature facilities we enjoy here at this WOS complex today.

Almost thirty years on we still have the pleasure of their regular visits here plus we will always have with us the legacy of their notable achievements such as this clubhouse and our swimming pool.

I have the pleasure today on behalf all past and present members of The Waikato Outdoor Society to bestow to you both the certification that you are now honoured Life Friends of WOS.

Our 21-22 year despite the seemingly never ending hassles of Covid and difficult management issues has proved to be one of our most successful years ever. The major project of course was completing the full renovation of our swimming pool, paid for and up and running right on schedule. Peggy, the project manager received superb back-up from a majority of the membership for this large undertaking which really reflects the power of the wonderful teamwork we have here at WOS.

Our endeavor is to do our best to provide the services that you members want from us, and it is timely to say what a boost it was when you members came up with all the extra funding needed for the unforeseen expense for the pool pavers. For months the focus was on the work associated with the pool, but maintenance and improvements carried on as usual, the kitchen sinks and water systems received a several thousand dollar upgrade, many smaller labor intensive smaller tasks still got done and we even got our club house roof painted by a few intrepid club members - thank you Roy & Sue & Gary - so yes a sterling year of achievement.

So, what is on the list next? – well, I guess one of the more serious things we need to look at is all of our hedges on our leased out land – take a careful look at them – they are no longer hedges they are a rows of rather tall trees –cutting and cleanup costs are escalating. The boundary trees on the road to the East side neighbors – so tall they are fast becoming too expensive for us to keep under control. Naturally we have gone to the professionals for advice and have planned accordingly with in-depth committee deliberations. The Committee decisions and costings for the remedial work will be included later in the Treasurer's report.

This Committee also has plans in hand to add a prefabricated block of two additional toilets, again details and costings will be detailed by the Treasurer.

Around 10 years ago our membership seemed static at 79 members however it is pleasing to see numbers have grown quite a bit recently and at 24th April 2022 we had 140 financial members which I believe is a new milestone for this complex. Our club according to many visitor reports is gaining a reputation for facilities and hospitality that ranks us up there with the best available.

This Executive and committee are focused on promoting improvement and enhancements that benefit <u>all</u> of you members and **not** just select individuals. My drive is to continue to steer away from catering to the wants of individuals. Decisions we make must be focused on to what best benefits <u>all</u> of our 140 members.

Of course, we the Executive and committee are elected volunteers and make no claims to be professionals however we like to aim high when doing our duties, each year seems to involve an increasing workload for us to hit our targets and keep our club ranking up there with the best of them. There have many notable achievements this year along with the truck load of extra hassles generated by the ever-changing Covid situations. 



- 3. Text the word "pic" to 021 265 0324 to find out the temperature of the Hot tub.




